The Gardens

The 25-year old **Jackson Garden** is part of a one-acre hillside property with original, large native oak and dogwood trees, an ideal setting for the cultivation of rhododendrons. This tour will showcase their lepidotes, native azaleas, wildflowers and some hollies.

The Gears Garden began in 1985 on 1.3 wooded acres of south central Chester County features over 250 hybrids and species of rhododendrons, 300 varieties of evergreen azaleas, many native azaleas (species and seedlings grown from seed collected in the wild) and eastern wildflowers. Jim welcomes you, but warns he has experienced extensive deer damage to plants this winter.

The 25-year old **Keim Garden**, set on 1.75 sloping acres with tall trees, features many varieties of lepidote rhododendrons, including many forms and hybrids of R. augustinii with which Brian has been experimenting the past few years. Early blooming native azaleas, spring bulbs and wildflowers, as well as various evergreens compliment the April garden.

The Directions to the Gardens

Directions to Jackson Garden at 730 Limehouse Road, Radnor (215-687-2289)

From Center City, take I-76 West, exit at Gulph Mills (exit 330), *turn left at dead end (stop sign), turn right (stop sign) into and follow Trinity Lane and signs to I-76 west. After crossing RR bridge, turn right into South Gulph Road, turn immediately into left lane and into Gypsy Lane. At 3rd stop sign, turn right into Pine Hill Road and left into Limehouse Road. 730 is at the end of the cul-de-sac (parking).

Coming south on I-476 from Norristown exit of PA Turnpike, follow signs to Valley Forge on I-76 west but exit immediately at Gulph Mills (exit 330) and follow directions *above.

Coming from I-95, take I-476 north and St. Davids exit to traffic light and follow King of Prussia Road. After 3rd traffic light, beyond top of hill, turn right into Hollow Road, left into Pine Hill Road, and again left into Limehouse Road to end of cul-de-sac (parking).

From points west and south (via PA Turnpike or Routes 422 or 202), go to King of Prussia intersection, turn right into South Gulph Road (Best Western to your right). After 1.7 miles (traffic light), turn right into Weadley Road. Go up the hill, one block beyond stop sign, turn left into Pine Hill Road and right into Limehouse Road to end of cul-de-sac (parking).



Directions to Gears Garden at 2065 Parkersville Road, West Chester (610-793-2313)

Travel South on Route 202 to Route 926. Turn left on Route 926, going west; proceed to stop sign and continue on Route 926. After crossing over railroad tracks go up a short steep hill and then a long steep hill. At the top of that hill continue 1/4 mile to the intersection of Parkersville Road. Turn right on Parkersville Road to the 3rd house on the right.

Directions to Keim Garden at 1189 Sewell Lane, Rydal (215-576-6494)

From the Pennsylvania Turnpike, exit at Willow Grove and keep to the left from the tollbooth, going south on Route 611 toward Willow Grove and Jenkintown. Stay with 611 South (which changes its name from Easton Road to Old York Road in Willow Grove) for approximately 5 miles until you come to Abington Hospital on your right and the Inn Flight Restaurant on your left. At that light, turn left on to Woodland Road. Proceed through two stop signs. At the next road, which comes in only on the right and is at the Penn State Abington campus, turn right on to Cloverly Lane. Follow Cloverly Lane to the stop sign and turn right on to Sewell Lane. 1189 is the first driveway on the left. Parking (limited) is available in the driveway, or on Cherry Lane, which is the first street to the left just past our driveway. Do not park on Sewell Lane.

From Washington Lane, proceed north through Jenkintown to the three way stop sign at the intersection of Washington Lane and Susquehanna Road, at the RR underpass just past the Rydal station. Turn left on to Susquehanna Road, under the underpass, and proceed to the traffic light at Susquehanna Road and Valley Road. Turn right on Valley Road, getting into the left hand lane to turn left at the next street on to Cloverly Lane. Proceed through one stop sign. The next left hand turn is Sewell Lane, turn left and 1189 is the first driveway on the left. Parking see above.


Valley Forge Chapter Flower (Truss) Show. Saturday, May 7 and Sunday, May 8, 2005
